Small Town, Big Fashion

Putting on a museum exhibition is a complex undertaking and organizing an exhibition of fashion or textile objects makes the undertaking even more challenging. When planning a fashion or textile exhibition for a small museum or heritage house, one is faced with yet more specific problems and complications. This paper explores this process through the experience of planning

and executing the exhibition Small Town, Big Fashion: Fashion in Southeastern New Brunswick from 1860s – 1960s for the heritage house The Keillor House Museum in Dorchester, New Brunswick. The exhibition was on display at this location for 4 months in 2013, before traveling to two more institutions. One of these institutions was another small heritage house in Moncton, New Brunswick, while the other was the New Brunswick Museum, the largest museum in the province. While often considered difficult, fashion and textile exhibitions are possible and important to have in small institutions. Despite small budgets, small staff numbers and

small spaces; professional exhibitions are possible, this paper explores the process of making this happen.
